INTRODUCTION

Schools of public health have been educating professionals in the techniques of health preservation and disease prevention and control since the first decades of the twentieth century. Some schools of public health had their beginnings in university schools of medicine; others were conceived from the outset as autonomous units within their parent institutions. In Fall 2003, there were 33 accredited schools of public health in the United States, at 10 private and 23 public universities. All 33 schools have been included in this data report.

Unlike other health profession schools which emphasize a specific clinical discipline (for example medicine or nursing), schools of public health educate a wide range of professionals, from biostatisticians and epidemiologists to health administrators, community health educators and specialists in areas such as managed care, environmental sciences, international health and the behavioral and social sciences.

The Association of Schools of Public Health (ASPH) is the only national organization representing the deans, faculty, and students of this Nation's 33 accredited schools of public health in the United States and Puerto Rico. The schools educate 19,000 students annually from every state in the U.S. and most countries throughout the world. The schools of public health are the primary educational system that trains personnel needed to operate public health, disease prevention and health promotion programs in the U.S. ASPH's principal purpose is to promote and improve the education and training of professional public health personnel.

ASPH collects and compiles aggregate data on applications, new enrollments, students and graduates in each school of public health. The information collected serves the schools and various federal, state and local agencies and private institutions in planning and implementing their respective public health training, research and service activities.

NOTES ON DATA

DATA COLLECTION

ASPH collects information from the 33 accredited schools of public health. This report presents data on applications, new enrollments and students for the fall semester or term of the current academic year (fall 2003 for this report). Data on graduates cover the entire academic year (2002-03 for this report).

The classification system for program areas was developed by the ASPH Data Advisory Committee in 1978 and has been used since the 1979-80 academic year. The system undergoes periodic review and revision by the Committee, with the approval of other appropriate committees and/or councils.

The ASPH Data Advisory Committee met in 1994 to review the data categories. The resulting changes in the classification system are reflected in this data report. International Health (INTHL) and Maternal & Child Health (MCH) were added as program area categories. Previously, those students were classified in the category of Public Health Practice & Program Management (PHP/PM). The

category Occupational Safety & Health (OS&H) was deleted. Those students are now included in the category of Environmental Sciences (ENV SC).

Under the ASPH data collection system, the schools report their applicants, students and graduates by the program area categories described on the previous page. Categorization is not always precise and there is some variance each year due to reclassification. In addition, a number of schools have program areas that include two or more of the ASPH categories. Finally, program areas within the schools are reorganized from time to time, with the result that two or more areas that were once separate in the ASPH classification system are later reported as a combined area. For these reasons, the data on program area should be viewed with caution.

Lastly, a number of schools allow dual specializations. Applicants, students and graduates with dual specializations are recorded as ".5" in each area.

HIGHLIGHTS AND TRENDS

In 2002-03, 33 accredited schools of public health existed in the United States, up from 24 accredited schools of public health in 1988/89. The highlights and trends in this report represent the data collected from these schools, which are accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH). All ASPH member schools reported data for the years 2002-03.

APPLICATIONS

Fall 2003

ASPH collects data on applications rather than individuals. ASPH does not have a centralized application process, and cannot determine the average number of applications submitted per applicant.

In the Fall 2003, there were 24,973.0 applications submitted, a 6.9 percent increase from 2002 (23,365.0). Submissions from female applicants constituted 68.9 percent of total applications and foreign nationals constituted 29.2 percent of total applications [Tables 1-1 and 1-2].

Of total U.S. applicants, 36.8 percent were members of minority groups (Asian, 15.0 percent; Black, 12.9 percent; Hispanic, 8.2 percent; American Indian/Alaskan Native, 0.7 percent) [Table 1-3].

Program areas with the highest number of applications were epidemiology (19.8 percent), health services administration (18.6 percent), health education/behavioral sciences (14.1 percent) and biostatistics (9.2 percent) [Table 1-6].

Of the total applications in 2003, approximately 55.2 percent were accepted, slightly lower than last year (57.7 percent) [Table 1-7]. New enrollments represented a little less than half of acceptances and 27.2 percent of applicants.

Acceptance rates were slightly higher for females (57.0 percent) than males (52.1 percent), lower for foreign nationals (40.3 percent) than for U.S. citizens and permanent residents (61.2 percent), and lower for minorities (54.5 percent) than for whites (67.1 percent) [Table 1-8]. The program areas with the highest acceptance rates were public health practice and program management at 64.9 percent and international health with a rate of 62.4 percent. The program area with the lowest acceptance rate was biomedical sciences with a rate of 30.6 percent.

APPLICATION TRENDS


1993- 2003

For the last decade, the total number of applications reported by the schools of public health has been steadily increasing despite a slight dip in applications in 2000. Since 1993, applications have increased by 51.3 percent from 16,509.0 to 24,973.0 applications [Table 1-12].

Over the past ten years, females have consistently applied to schools of public health in greater numbers than males. In 1993, females submitted 61.2 percent of applications. In 2003, the number of female applicants rose to 68.9 percent. Since 1993, the number of female applicants has increased by 70.6 percent compared with a 19.0 percent increase in the number of male applicants [Table 1-9].

Since 1993, the number of applications received from U.S. members of minority groups increased at a rate higher than overall applications (76.6 percent increase for minority applicants compared with a 43.5 percent overall application increase of U.S. citizens) [Table 1-10]. The minority groups that experienced the most growth over the past decade were Asians and Blacks.

NEW ENROLLMENTS

Fall 2003

In Fall 2003, there were 6,786.0 new enrollments representing 35.7 percent of the total enrollments in the schools [Table 2-6]. In 2002, there were 6,329.0 new enrollments representing 35.4 percent of total enrollments [Table 2-7].


The proportion of new female students was 69.7 percent, while foreign students represented 16.9 percent of new enrollments [Tables 2-1 and 2-2]. These proportions are quite similar to the total student enrollment for females (68.5 percent) and foreign nationals (16.8 percent) [Tables 3-1 and 3-2].

The proportion of new minority students has decreased from 2002 by 1.3 percent. In 2003, 1,859.0 or 33.1 percent of U.S. new enrollments were minorities, down from 34.4 percent (1,767.0) of U.S. new enrollments in 2002 [Table 2-3].

In 2003, the program areas with the largest concentrations of new enrollments were health services administration (1,404.5 or 20.7 percent), epidemiology (1,179.0 or 17.4 percent), and health education/behavioral sciences (896.5 or 13.2 percent) [Table 2-4].

Trends for schools of public health for the past 10 years indicate that the percentage of new enrollments as a percentage of acceptances and as a percentage of applications have been decreasing, although there were slight increases in 2000 and 2003 [Table 2-7].

STUDENTS

Fall 2003

There were 19,003.0 students enrolled in the schools in 2003, a 6.0 percent increase from last year (17,933.5) [Table 3-11]. Of this total, 68.5 percent were female and 16.8 percent were foreign nationals [Tables 3-1 and 3-2].

Of the U.S. students, 5,256.5 or 33.3 percent were members of minority groups (Asian, 11.7 percent; Black, 11.3 percent; Hispanic, 9.3 percent; American Indian/Alaskan Native, 1.0 percent) [Table 3-3]. Minority enrollment increased by 8.1 percent from last year (4,864.0 were members of a minority group in 2002) [Table 3-12].

In 2003, more than half of the students (53.7 percent) were enrolled in MPH programs and 75.5 percent of the students were enrolled in master's degree programs [Tables 3-4 and 3-5]. The remaining 24.5 percent of the students were enrolled in doctoral degree programs. A higher proportion of males (26.0 percent) pursue doctorates than females (23.5 percent), and a higher proportion of foreign national students (36.9 percent) pursue doctorates than U.S. students (22.0 percent) [Table 3-4]. Of the students that were U.S. citizens, 24.1 percent of White students were pursuing doctorates compared with 23.9 percent of American Indian/Alaskan Native students, 18.9 percent of Asian students, 18.2 percent of Black students, followed by 12.9 percent of Hispanic students.

There were some differences in program areas based on demographic characteristics. Females represented three times the percentage of males enrolled in nutrition (2.9 percent female vs. 1.1 percent male), and more than double the percentage of males enrolled in health education/behavioral sciences (17.4 percent female vs. 7.6 percent male) and maternal and child health (6.1 percent female vs. 2.6 percent male) [Table 3-6]. Males represented a much greater percentage than females enrolled in environmental sciences (14.9 percent male vs. 8.7 percent female). Foreign nationals represented more than four times the percentage of U.S. citizens enrolled in biostatistics (18.4 percent foreign nationals vs. 4.5 percent U.S. citizens) and a greater percentage of those students enrolled in international health (9.2 percent foreign nationals vs. 6.9 percent U.S. citizens), while U.S. citizens represented more than twice the percentage of foreign nationals enrolled in health education/behavioral sciences (15.9 percent U.S. citizens vs. 6.6 percent foreign nationals).

More than half (52.5 percent) of the students were enrolled in three program areas; epidemiology (19.9 percent), health services administration (18.3 percent), and health education/behavioral sciences (14.3 percent) [Table 3-7].

The program areas with the largest proportion of doctoral students were biomedical sciences (64.9 percent) and biostatistics (44.1 percent), followed by epidemiology (31.4 percent) [Table 3-8].

In 2003, 27.6 percent of the students were part-time [Table 3-9]. The proportion of part-time students varied greatly among the schools.

STUDENT TRENDS

1993 - 2003

In 2003, there were 19,003.0 students enrolled in the schools of public health and in 1993 there were 14,449.0 students enrolled, a 31.5 percent increase [Table 3-11].


In 2003, female students represented 68.5 percent of total enrollments. This representation has been constant over the past decade, but the number of female enrollees has increased 43.5 percent since 1993 compared with a 10.8 percent increase of male enrollees [Table 3-11]. In 2003, foreign nationals constituted 16.8 percent of the total student body, slightly lower than last year's 17.6 percent.

Total minority enrollment nearly doubled, from 2,781.0 students in 1993 to 5,256.5 students in 2003 [Table 3-12]. Minority students constituted 23.5 percent of U.S. students in 1993 compared with 33.3 percent in 2003. The minority groups that experienced the largest growth over the past decade were Asians (120.9 percent) and Blacks (96.2 percent).


With regard to degree objective, there has been very little change since 1993. In 2003, over half (53.7 percent) of the students were enrolled in MPH programs, 75.5 percent of enrolled students were in master's degree programs and 24.5 percent in doctoral degree programs [Table 3-5]. In 1993, 49.9 percent of the students were enrolled in MPH programs, 76.4 percent were enrolled in master's degree programs, and 23.5 percent were enrolled in doctoral degree programs [Table 3-14].

For the past ten years, the program areas that comprise the largest proportions of students (epidemiology, health services administration, health education/behavioral sciences, and environmental sciences) have remained constant, though the proportions have fluctuated in the various program areas [Table 3-15].

GRADUATES

2002-03

There were 5,906.0 graduates in 2002-03, a 4.3 percent increase from 2001-02 (5,664.0) [Table 4-1]. In 2002-03, females represented 69.2 percent of total graduates and foreign nationals constituted 16.3 percent of total graduates [Table 4.2]. These percentages are consistent with total student enrollment.

In 2002-03, minorities received 32.7 percent of degrees awarded to U.S. students (Asian, 13.9 percent; Black, 11.2 percent; Hispanic, 7.0 percent; American Indian/Alaskan Native, 0.6 percent) [Table 4-3]. 2001-2002 data indicated that minorities received 33.4 percent of degrees awarded to U.S. students, a slightly higher percentage.

In 2002-03, the MPH degree was awarded to 65.0 percent of the total degree recipients and 89.9 percent of total degree recipients were awarded masters degrees [Tables 4-5 and 4-6]. Doctoral degrees were awarded to 595.0 individuals or 10.1 percent of the total degree recipients. The highest proportion of doctoral degree recipients was awarded to the PhD (7.5 percent) followed by both the DrPH and ScD at 1.2 percent each. A higher proportion of males (10.4 percent) than females (9.8 percent) received doctoral degrees, and a higher proportion of foreign nationals (15.0 percent) than U.S. citizens (9.1 percent) were awarded doctoral degrees [Table 4-4].

In 2002-03, 125.5 or 2.1 percent of graduates received a joint degree [Tables 4-7 and 4-8]. The joint degree combination with the highest concentration of graduates was the MD-MPH with 17.1 percent of all joint degree recipients [Tables 4-7 and 4-8].

Overall, the program areas with the highest concentrations of graduates were health services administration (19.8 percent), epidemiology (18.3 percent), and health education/behavioral sciences (13.1 percent) [Table 4-10]. The program areas with the highest concentrations of doctoral degree recipients were biomedical laboratory sciences (49.7 percent) and nutrition (21.4 percent), followed by biostatistics (16.8 percent) [Table 4-6].

GRADUATE TRENDS

1993-2003


In 2002-03, there were 5,906.0 graduates from the schools of public health, a 41.5 percent increase from 1992-93 (4,175.0 graduates) [Table 4-11]. The number and proportion of female graduates continues to increase. In 1993, female graduates totaled 2,673.0 or 64.1 percent compared with 4,086.5 or 69.2 percent in 2003. Female graduates have increased 52.9 percent since 1993, compared with a 20.9 percent increase in male graduates. U.S. graduates have increased by 44.0 percent since 1993, compared with a 28.5 percent increase in foreign national graduates.

Overall, the number of minority graduates has increased 135.4 percent since 1993. Asians increased by 208.6 percent; Blacks increased by 128.0 percent; and Hispanics increased by 70.6 percent. Between 1992-93 and 2002-03, American Indian/Alaskan Native graduates increased by 60.5 percent [Table 4-12]. In 2003, the proportion of minority graduates was 32.7 percent of total U.S. graduates, up from 1992-93 when the proportion of minority graduates was 20.8 percent of total U.S. graduates.

Since 1992-93, the proportion of graduates with prior MD degrees has increased from 18.6 percent to 19.1 percent in 2002-03 [Table 4-12]. In 2002-03, U.S. citizens comprised 61.3 percent of graduates with prior MD degrees and foreign nationals comprised 37.7 percent.

The MPH has remained the most commonly awarded degree over the past decade [Table 4-13]. It accounted for 65.0 percent of the total degrees awarded in 2002-03. The MS degree represented 10.3 percent of total; MHA/MHSA degree represented 4.4 percent of total degrees; and the MSPH degree at 2.8 percent of total degrees. Since 1992-93, proportions of degrees awarded have been mostly constant.

In 2002-03, the PhD degree was the most awarded doctoral degree and has been for over ten years. This degree accounted for 7.5 percent of total degrees awarded; DrPH and ScD degrees each represented 1.2 percent of total degrees.



Concentrations of graduates in the different program areas have been constant since 1992-93, with the exception of public health practice/program management [Table 4-14]. The program areas that have grown most significantly in terms of the proportion of graduates since 1992-93 were epidemiology (increase of 114.5 percent) and health education/behavioral science (increase of 88.6 percent). International health, which has been tracked only since 1993-94, increased by 87.5 percent. Numbers of public health practice/program management graduates decreased by 26.7 percent over this ten-year time frame.

(Percent Increase of Graduates Between 1992 & 2003)**


